

1 Q Okay, you're done?

2 A Yes.

3 Q What do you recall writing down?

4 A In my description of the eyes, I described them as
5 hazel green with a right scleral hemorrhage, congestion, no
6 petechiae.

7 THE COURT: No petechiae?

8 THE WITNESS: I said that on the examination.

9 Q That particular photograph you just looked at on 296,
10 you said has petechiae?

11 A Yes, if you want to put it up again?

12 Q Yes.

13 (Displayed on the monitor, in open court.)

14 A The petechiae, it is a single petechiae, and it is very
15 subtle. It is the petechiae I am talking about that is at the
16 3 o'clock position there.

17 I noted what I called the scleral hemorrhage.

18 The white of the eye, that white streak is the scleral
19 hemorrhage. Then the white dot is the petechiae, which I
20 noticed when reviewing the photographs later.

21 Sometimes at the autopsy table it is less easy to see
22 things, but when looking at the photographs, one of the reasons
23 we take photographs is to document injuries we might miss.

24 Technically, if they are subtle injuries, the first time
25 around when we do the autopsy we make a diagram, we take
